It was only then I realized, I had accidentally made a 19. _____ flaw. My face was red as an apple.

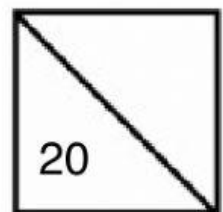
Conclusion
