In general, some is used in positive sentences:



There are some birds in the cage.



You have some butter around your mouth.





In general, any is used in <u>negative</u> sentences and <u>questions</u>:

I looked in the cupboard but I couldn't find any biscuits.



We don't need <u>any</u> rice.

There aren't any people in the restaurant.



Do you have any brothers or sisters?

Did you catch any fish?



Do you have any hamburgers in the cupboard?




