## September 11 Terrorists Attacks



On September 11, 2001, 2,977 people were killed in the deadliest terrorist attacks in American history.

The country was utterly shocked. Two planes, hijacked by Islamic jihadists vowing death to all Americans, plowed into the Twin Towers of the World Trade Center in New York. Another plane was flown into the Pentagon in Washington, DC. A fourth plane, presumably headed for the White House or the US Capitol, was ultimately diverted by passengers and ended up crashing in an empty field in Pennsylvania. Millions of Americans watched the second plane hit the South Tower on live television.

It was a terrifying, startling, and humbling event for the country. The 9/11 attacks were the deadliest attacks on American soil since the shock attack at Pearl Harbor 60 years before. The attacks were made even more poignant by their central location and its ongoing devastation. The attacks on the Twin Towers occurred in the country's busiest city on a busy workday. And, the staggered nature of the attacks meant that news footage captured almost everything as it happened, ensuring that most Americans saw the events precisely as they were unfolding.
