

WHEN DO WE USE A, AN, SOME OR ANY?

1. **A** is used with **singular countable** nouns that begin with a **consonant**.
 - There is a dog in the garden. (Hay un perro en el Jardín)
2. **An** is used with **singular countable** nouns that begin with a **vowel**.
 - There is an apple in the fridge. (Hay una manzana en la nevera)
3. **Some** can be used with **plural countable nouns** and **uncountable nouns**.
Some is usually used in positive statements.
 - There is some cheese in the fridge. (Hay algo de queso en la nevera)
4. **Any** is usually used for **plural countable nouns** and **uncountable nouns** in questions and negative statements.
 - Is there any bread in the house? (¿Hay algo de pan en casa?)

IMPORTANT TO REMEMBER THE FOLLOWING

Remember to use **there is** with uncountable nouns and singular countable nouns.

Remember to use **there are** with plural countable nouns.
