

Question Tags



We can add question tags like *isn't it?*, *can you?* or *didn't they?* to a statement to make it into a question.

We often use question tags when we expect the listener to agree with our statement.

If the **statement** is **positive**, we use a *negative question tag*.

If it is a **negative statement**, we use a *positive question tag*.

It is a cold day, *isn't it?*
It is not a cold day, *is it?*

They are very mysterious, *aren't they?*
They are not very mysterious, *are they?*

We like serial killers, *don't we?*
We do not like serial killers, *do we?*
