

MATCH THE FOLLOWING COMPUTER TERMS WITH THEIR DEFINITIONS

1	Address Bar	A	The bar or bars on the top your screen where you find images that you can select to carry out various functions
2	Boot	B	A graphical bar located at the top of a web page that links users to other portions of the page
3	Browser	C	The setting most often used by a program. For example, if you save something it is saved in the default setting, unless you make changes to save it somewhere else.
4	CPU	D	A viewing device that contains your computer screen
5	Default	E	A name given to a user on a computer or a computer network. It can also be called the account name, login ID, or user ID
6	Desktop	F	A standardized name for addressing documents accessible over the internet. The URL is the name entered in the address bar. E.g. the URL for NLLC would be <a href="http://www.nald.ca/nllc">www.nald.ca/nllc</a>
7	Hardware	G	Secret characters or words used to gain access. Using passwords helps to ensure privacy and security.
8	Icon	H	Also known as signing on to a network.
9	Log on	I	Programs used to carry out functions on a computer
10	Monitor	J	Being able to be connected to the internet
11	Mouse	K	The central processing unit or the "brains" of your computer.
12	Navigation Bar	L	The physical devices that make up a computer.
13	Online Access	M	The name used to describe the text box used to enter a website's address in a browser.
14	Password	N	The screen you see when you boot up your computer.
15	PC	O	To turn on a computer, usually with a switch located on the front of the CPU
16	Power up	P	A software program that allows you to explore the Internet. Some browsers are Internet Explorer, Netscape Navigator and Mozilla Firefox.
17	Software	Q	A personal computer which is also known as a Desktop or a single-user computer
18	Toolbar	R	A device that allows the user to navigate around the screen
19	URL	S	A graphic picture of a file or a program that can be opened by clicking on it.
20	User Name	T	To power up or turn on your computer
