2. John Wayne Gacy:

John Wayne Gacy was a friendly man who threw popular block p	arties,
and often performed as a clown at local children's parties. In 197	8, when a
15-year-old boy who had last been seen with Gacy went 1	, police
obtained a 2 for Gacy's house. There they found clo	othing
belonging to several young men previously reported missing. In	a space
beneath the house, where a 3 was present, the	y found
the 4 of 29 boys and teenagers that Gacy ha	d raped
and 5 Gacy's ex-wife had 6 about the odor for years too.	
Gacy admitted to killing several additional men, $7_{}$ of the	ir bodies in
a nearby lake. His attempts at presenting an 8 fail	ed, and he
was convicted on 33 counts of murder and executed by 9	in

1994.







3. Jeffrey Dahmer:

Dahmer's sensational tr	rial, featuring lurid desc	riptions of hi	m eating the
body parts of some of hi	is victims and admission	ns of necroph	ilia, renewed
the world's interest in s	serial killers. In 1992, Da	hmer was 4_	to
o57 years in iail, but was	killed by a fellow 5	inst tw	o vears later.









Handsome, well-educated and charming, Ted Bundy focused primarily on attractive college students (30). He managed to escape police 1_____ not once, but twice, while 2____ in Colorado. He moved to Florida, where he killed several members of a sorority and his 3_____, a 12-year-old girl who he raped and murdered.



It was the first murder trial to be fully televised, and featured Bundy acting as one of his own 4_____. He became a media star, welcoming interviewers to his 5_____, receiving letters of admiration from fans (and even marrying one of them) and providing an endless list of 6____ about additional murders he may have committed, in the hopes of delaying his 7_____. It didn't work; he was executed in the 8_____ in 1989, with the true number of his victims unknown.
