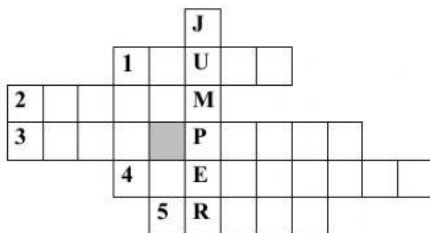

A Good Sense of Humour

Humour, the tendency of experiences to provoke laughter and provide amusement, affects how we perceive and respond to life. It helps to improve the quality of life and may relieve the body from so many health problems. In fact, humans are the only creatures on earth with the ability to laugh.

A

It has also been shown that when laughing, the brain releases endorphins that can relieve some physical pain. No one can question that a good sense of humour and daily laughter benefits our life quality as well as our immune system.

B

The difference between humour and laughter is that humour is a process while laughter is the response to a stimulus. People of all ages and cultures respond to humour. The majority of people are able to experience humour, i.e., to be amused, to laugh or smile at something funny, and so they are considered to have a sense of humour.

C

On the other hand, regular laughter sessions can have important effects on our health. For instance, laughter is thought to be a strong medicine for stress and researchers found a direct link between laughter and the way our bodies function. Laughter causes the body to work like a clock and hardly ever has difficulty finding the necessary tools to function properly.

D

The person who has never experienced this process may find this behaviour inexplicable, strange, or even irrational. Humour depends on geographical location, culture, maturity, level of education, intelligence and context. For example, those who live in the north do not respond in the same way as those living in the south.
