English similes

A simile is a comparison of one thing with another thing, for example *He is* **as brave as** *a lion*.

Verbal similes

We can also describe a person by comparing their actions to those of another person, animal, or object. We use the word **like** after the verb, for example *They fight like cats and dogs* (= they fight violently, or often).
