**A Crime Writer**

Colin Dexter was born in 1930, in Stamford, Lincolnshire. He studied Latin and Ancient Greek at Cambridge University, and after graduating became a school-master, teaching Latin and Greek in schools in the Midlands. After that he worked as an educational administrator until his retirement in 1988. Colin Dexter turned to crime writing when he was in his mid-40s, and has written thirteen detective novels so far, including Last Bus to Woodstock (1975), Service of All the Dead (1979), The Wench is Dead (1989), and Death is Now My Neighbour (1996). They are all based in and around the ancient university city of Oxford. His novels are famous for their two police detectives, Inspector Morse and his assistant, Sergeant Lewis. All the Morse stories have been adapted for television, attracting large audiences whenever they are shown. Public demand has been so great that further Morse stories have been specially written by other authors, and the series has been successfully exported to other countries.
