

## Grammar: Present Simple: Affirmative and Negative

We use the present simple to talk about facts and routines.

We make negative statements in the simple present with *don't* and *doesn't*.

Affirmative	Negative
I go to an after-school program.	I <i>don't</i> go home after school.
You walk to school.	You <i>don't</i> walk home.
She plays with her friends. He plays soccer.	She <i>doesn't</i> play with me. He <i>doesn't</i> play basketball.
We share snacks.	We <i>don't</i> share our dinner.
They ride bikes in the park.	They <i>don't</i> ride bikes to school.
