MATCH THESE WORDS TO THEIR DEFINITIONS ON THE RIGHT:

STRENGTH	Achieve or have the standard of skill, knowledge, or ability that is necessary for doing or being something
WEAKNESS	Something a person is good at
SKILL	The jobs that someone has had, or the type of work they have done, in the past
REQUIREMENT	A system of working in which people work a set number of hours within a fixed period of time, but can change the time they start or finish work
QUALIFICATION	A particular part or quality of someone or something that is not good or effective
WORKING EXPERIENCE	Payment system in the company
REFERENCE	An ability to do an activity or job well, especially because you have practiced it
FULL-TIME WORK	Something that you must do, or something you need
PART-TIME WORK	A letter that is written by someone who knows you, to describe you and say if you are suitable for a job, course, etc.
REMUNERATION SYSTEM	Done for all the hours people usually work
FLEXITIME	If you work like this, you work for only some of the day or the week
QUALIFY FOR	An ability, characteristic, or experience that makes you suitable for a particular job or activity
