Possessive nouns

Reminder: Possessive nouns are used when the noun owns something. It belongs to the noun. Examples: The cat's toy is under the couch. → the cat owns the toy The neighbour's car is red. → the neighbour owns the car When the nouns is singular, you add an apostrophe and the letter "s". When the nouns is plural and ends in an "s", you only add an apostrophe after the "s". Examples: All the players' jerseys are dirty. → the players own the jerseys Lions' dens are not a safe place to be. → the lions own the dens
