going to for intention

We use "going to" when we have the intention to do something before we speak. We have already made a decision before speaking. Look at the example:

• John has won the lottery. He says he's going to buy a Porsche.

going to for prediction

We often use "going to" to make a prediction about the future. Our prediction is based on present evidence. We are saying what we think will happen. Here is one example:

· The sky is very black. It's going to snow.
