CONCLUSION

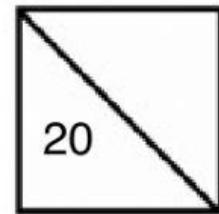
That is the reason why I still hold on to the pen to remind me of this very special person.
