Madame Tussauds

Many people like to see celebrities; but some celebrities don't usually like talking to the public. There is one place in England where you can look at celebrities - lots of them - every day: this is Madame Tussaud's museum. If you want, you can talk to film stars and politicians in Madame Tussaud's, but they can't say anything to you because the "famous people" in the building are really made out of wax.

Marie Tussaud was born in France in 1765. When she was a child, she learned how to make wax models of people. Then, in 1802, she moved to England, travelling round the country with her exhibition of wax figures. In 1835 at the age of 70, she finally moved to London. There, she opened her museum on Baker Street and it is one of the most popular tourist attractions in London. Around two million people visit the museum every year to take photos of the wax models of famous people such as actors, pop stars and the Royal Family. It's not easy to make wax figures; it takes around four months to make them. The head alone takes five weeks! When a person stops being famous or popular they take the model out and re-use it for another person!

On most days of the year there are a lot of visitors outside Madame Tussaud's because the collection of models is really big and is always changing.

Many people are famous for a short time, but some are famous for ever!

*Wax: an artificial substance used for making candles and models
