

Relative Pronouns

Reminder:

A pronoun is a word that replaces a noun.

Relative Pronouns

Relative pronouns connect ideas together. These words give more information about the nouns with which they are used.

who: refers to a person (use it when you can replace with he/she)

whom: refers to a person (use it when you can replace with him/her)

which: refers to an animal or thing

that: refers to a person, animal, or things

Example:

The man **who** called earlier wanted to talk to my father. (He called.)

I know **whom** this necklace belongs to. (The necklace belongs to her.)

Indian food, **which** I eat all the time, can be very spicy.

Laura went to the restaurant **that** just opened last week.
