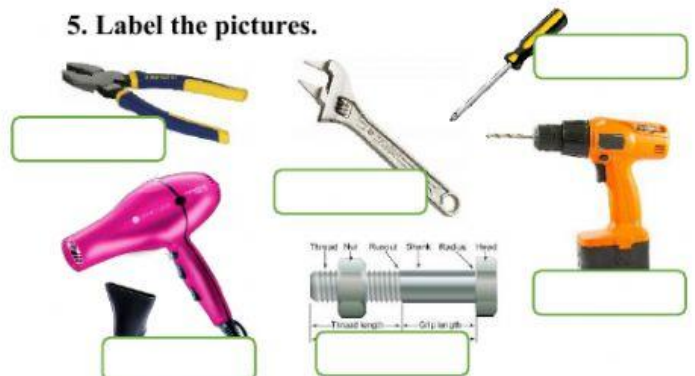

Magic 5 tablet Review ★★★★★

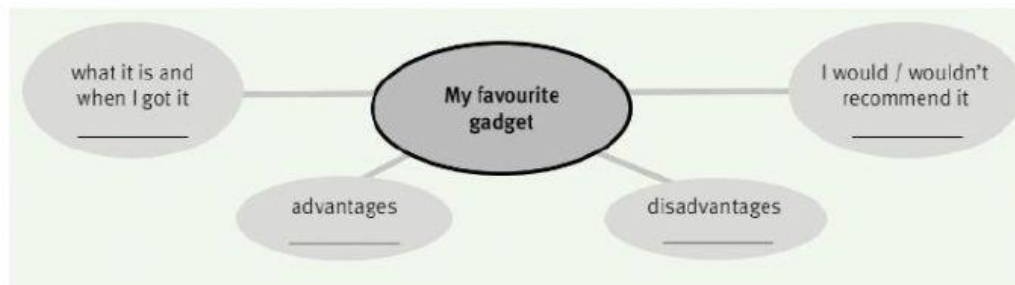

I recently got a Magic 5 tablet and I'm very happy with it. It looks really nice and the software seems to work very well. Here are some of the pros and cons. It was very easy to set up, it's quite light (only 340g) and it's a great gadget for checking social networking sites and reading e-books. I also thought the screen resolution was impressive while I was watching films. My favourite thing is the voice function – that works really well.

For me the main disadvantage is that it's Wi-Fi only, so it wasn't great while I was travelling.
