A The Science Museum

Did you know that more than 200,000 people visit the Science Museum in London each month? That's a lot of people, so it must be a great place to go! There are shows, talks and some fantastic 3D IMAX films to see. Look out for the Space Station 3D film, and experience life on board the new International Space Station. Float alongside the astronauts and see how they live in space! The Science Museum is a great place for people of all ages, and it's FREE! That should please your mum and dad!



B The Eden Project

The Eden project is a huge rainforest, but it isn't in South America. It's in Cornwall in the south of England! There are two huge covered greenhouses which are called *Biomes*. Inside these, there are over 100,000 plants from different parts of the world. There is plenty to do - with talks, story telling and music events. In fact, Eden could become one of the country's best places for listening to live music, as well as being a fantastic environmental project! They've had plenty of famous stars there already!

C Cotswold Wildlife Park

The Cotswold Wildlife Park in Oxfordshire has some fantastic mammals, birds, reptiles and other creatures. The Park has wonderful gardens, so there's plenty of space and plenty to do. Watch out for special events. Penguin feeding takes place at 11 a.m. and 4 p.m. every day (except Fridays) and you can ask the keeper questions afterwards. There are also some fantastic demonstrations with birds of prey. You may be lucky enough to hold an eagle!

D Alton Towers

If you're looking for excitement and fun, you'll find it at Alton Towers! It's Britain's biggest and best known theme park, and it's open from March until November every year. There are all the famous rides such as *Nemesis*, or *Oblivion*, and the latest ride for 2002 is called *Air*. You lie down with your face only a few centimetres from the ground, and travel at speeds of 70km per hour! Tell your parents they can find out times and prices on the website!
