Ten days, 6,000 km, mountains, desert -

and one very old car! It was a journey that these students will never forget.

Yesterday, 2,892 college students finished the 4L Trophy race. It is a competition for 18-28-year-olds to drive from France to Morocco in a Renault 4L -

a car from the 1960s, 70s, and 80s. The race started ten days ago, but the real challenge started many months before.

First, the teams needed to pay €9,500 to enter the race and to buy a car. After finding a Renault 4L, the students prepared their cars for the long journey. Then they drove to Biarritz, in the south of France, for the start of the race.
