### 1- Ponte Vecchio

The Ponte Vecchio, "Old Bridge", is a medieval **stone arch bridge** in Florence, Italy. The bridge was built in Roman times and first appears in a document of 996. The bridge consists of three segmental arches: the main arch has a span of 30 meters.

### 3- Puente de la Mujer

The Puente de la Mujer is a rotating **footbridge**. The bridge represents a couple dancing tango, with the white mast symbolising the man and the curve of the bridge, the woman. The bridge was constructed in Spain in 1999 and donated to Buenos Aires. The opening ceremony was the 20th December 2001.

### 2- Tower Bridge

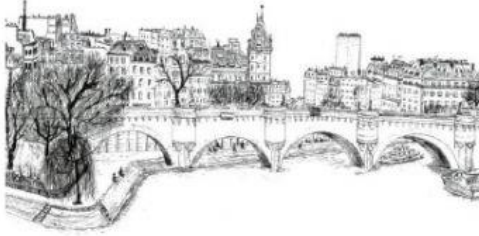
Tower Bridge is a **suspension bridge** with giant moveable **roadways** that lift up for passing **ships**. It is to this day considered an engineering marvel and one of London's favourite icons. It was built between 1886 and 1894 and it's 244 metres long.

### 4- Rosario-Victoria Bridge

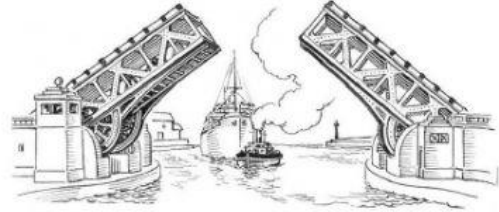
The modern design of this **cable-stayed bridge** can be appreciated clearly from the Paraná **river** area in the northern part of the city. The 60-kilometer structure links the city of Rosario to Victoria, in the Province of Entre Ríos. The construction started in 1997 and it's opening ceremony was the 22th May of 2003.
