if clause	result clause
Past Simple	would / wouldn't
If it rained,	I would take an umbrella.
If it didn't rain,	I would walk in the park.
If it rained,	I wouldn't walk in the park.
If it didn't rain,	I wouldn't take an umbrella.

## More examples:

We would play outdoors if it was sunny and warm. (play, be)

Ice-cream would melt if you didn't keep it in the freezer. (melt, not / keep)

The flower wouldn't grow if I didn't water it. (not / grow, not / water)

I would be very sad if you lost my book. (be, lose)

They would arrive on time if they weren't lost. (arrive, not / be)

He wouldn't buy it if he wasn't rich. (buy, not / be)
