

Second Conditional (Type 2)



if clause	result clause
Past Simple	would / wouldn't
If it rained,	I would take an umbrella.
If it didn't rain,	I would walk in the park.
If it rained,	I wouldn't walk in the park.
If it didn't rain,	I wouldn't take an umbrella.

More examples:

We **would** play outdoors **if** it **was** sunny and warm. (play, be)
 Ice-cream **would** melt **if** you **didn't** keep it in the freezer. (melt, not / keep)
 The flower **wouldn't** grow **if** I **didn't** water it. (not / grow, not / water)
 I **would** be very sad **if** you **lost** my book. (be, lose)
 They **would** arrive on time **if** they **weren't** lost. (arrive, not / be)
 He **wouldn't** buy it **if** he **wasn't** rich. (buy, not / be)
