

THERE IS/THERE ARE

"there's" or "there are" – which form is correct?

Note: *there is* = *there's*

(there's / there are) a T-shirt on the bed.

(are there / there are) two books on the floor.

(is there / there's) a laptop on the desk.

(is there / there are) five pencils on the sofa.

Answer the questions using "Yes, there is." / "No, there isn't." / "Yes, there are." / "No, there aren't."
