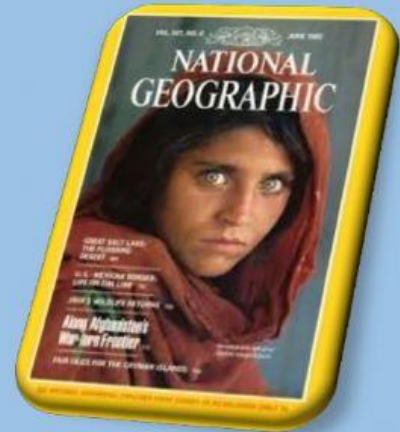


NATIONAL GEOGRAPHIC MAGAZINE

The first issue of National Geographic magazine was published in 1888, just nine months after the society was founded. The stamp was its characteristic National Geographic style, it reinvented itself from a line close to scientific journalism to being a magazine famous for its exclusive graphic material, it was in January 1905 when many full-page photos taken in Tibet were published in the years 1900 and 1901 by two scouts sent by the Russian Empire, Gombozhab Tsybikov and Ovshe Norzunov. The June 1985 issue on its cover has a photo of a 13-year-old Afghan girl named Sharbat Gula, becoming one of the magazine's most recognizable images.
