Using a or an

I'm not quite sure when I should use 'a' and when I should use 'an'?



The rule is quite simple:

Use <u>an</u> before a word that starts with a vowel sound. (Remember, vowels are a, e, i, o and u.)

If the word does not start with a vowel sound use a.

So, you should say <u>a</u> man, <u>a</u> coat and <u>a</u> hat and <u>an</u> elephant <u>an</u> ant and <u>an</u> octopus.
