Queen Victoria was queen of the United Kingdom for 64 years! She **married** her German **cousin**, Prince Albert. They loved each other very much. They had nine children. When Albert died in 1861, Victoria **wore** black clothes for **the rest of her life**. But she didn't like black **funerals**. On the day of her funeral Britain was **decorated in** white and purple.

Victoria was very popular with the British. In 1887 there were big street parties for her. **Signs** everywhere said, '50 years our Queen'. In 1897 there were more parties for her after 60 years as queen. And of course British people liked her! Britain was rich and Queen Victoria even became the Empress of India. In the **Victorian age** Britain had a **large** Empire – with **land** in Africa, India, Hong Kong, Australia, New Zealand and Canada. And she built England. A lot of people now live in Victorian houses. The town halls, libraries, universities, museums, churches and even the **railway system** also **date from** that time. Well, over half of the world's **goods** were transported to Britain by ships. Victorians also **invented** lots of technology such as **electricity**, the car, and the radio. Yet, millions had difficult lives and **suffered** high **death rate** – the workers who built the railway lines died more while they were working than the soldiers who fought against Napoleon. Children as young as 6-7 years old worked in **factories** and **mines**. Charles Dickens wrote his famous books – 'Oliver Twist' and 'Hard Times' – to tell about their hard lives.
