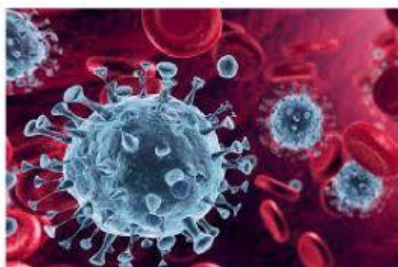

Drive-in and walk-in COVID-19 testing centre comes to Slough



The first **hybrid** walk-in and drive-in COVID-19 testing centre in the country is coming to Slough from tomorrow afternoon.

The testing centre will be based in the Montem Car Park, Montem Lane. People who do not show **symptoms** but are worried they may be infected will be able to visit for a test by foot or in a car.

The centre will be open for people who make an appointment and for those who just want to drop-in, but the council is **warning** drop-ins may have a slightly longer wait.

Up to four people can come together in the same car and all ages are welcome. People can visit from anywhere in the country and **actual** testing should take between 15 and 30 minutes.

Anyone arriving on foot over the age of three must wear face coverings or they will not be tested. There will be a special area for testing for those who do not wish to remove face coverings in public. A **curtained** area is available. Parents are welcome to bring children.

Josie Wragg, chief executive at Slough Borough Council, said: "We are proud to be **organising** the first **hybrid site** in the country. People can drive and walk in with no appointment."

"An area like Slough has seen high levels of infection and has a large black and ethnic minority **population** which is more at risk."
