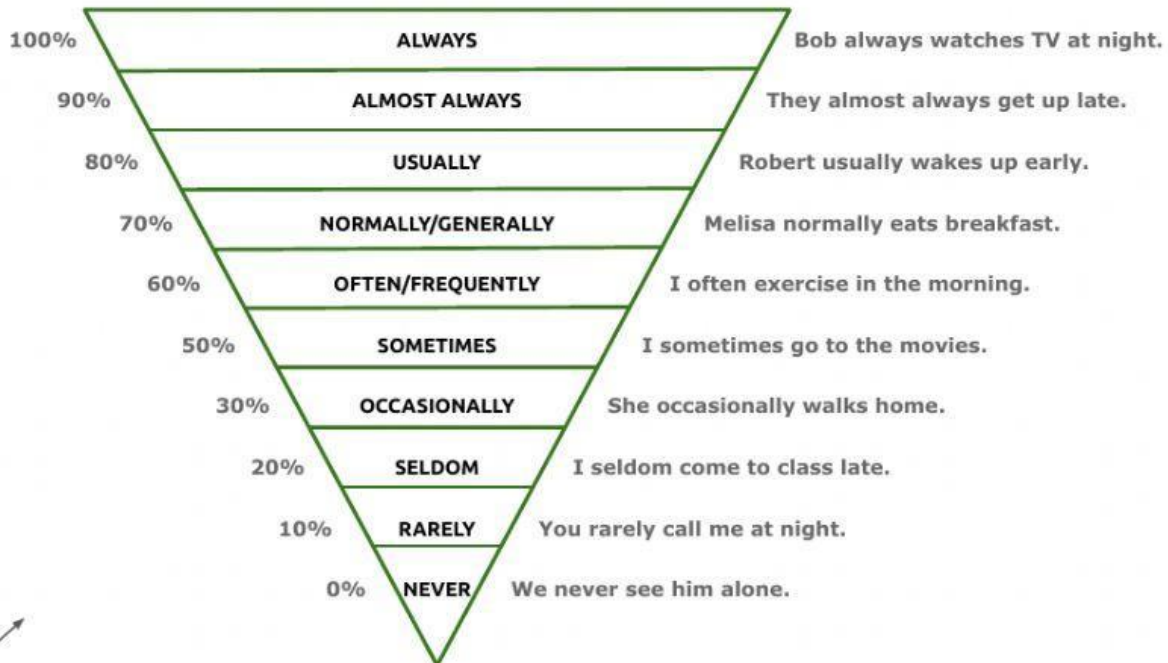

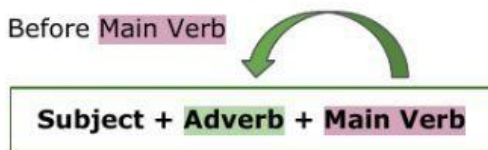
Adverbs of frequency



*Only approximate numbers

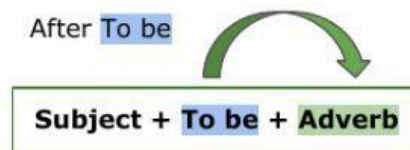
Word order

Before Main Verb



I **always** **arrive** late.

After To be



I **am** **always** late.

For **emphasis**, we can use *usually*, *often*, *sometimes*, *frequently*, *normally* and *occasionally* at the beginning of a sentence, and *sometimes* and *often* at the end.

Sometimes I eat pizza.

I eat pizza **sometimes**.
