Verbs

A verb tells you what the subject in the sentence is doing or being.			
For example: I <i>am going</i> to the store.			
The verb <u>am going</u> tells you what the subject (I) is doing.			
A verb is a necessary element in a sentence. You can even express a complete thought			
using only a verb.			
For example: Run!			
Action vs. Non-action verbs			
Verbs can tell you what the subject is doing. These are called action verbs.			
For example:			
Luke <i>threw</i> the ball at Leia.			
Amanda <u>reads</u> the newspaper every morning.			
Even when the action is figurative (not literal), it counts as an action verb. For example:			
She <u>broke</u> the school record. → Nothing is actually being broken, but it is still an action verb.			
However, verbs can also indicate the subject's state of being, sense, emotion, desire, possession, or opinion. These are called non-action verbs. The most common non-action verb is <u>to be</u> . (être)			
For example: I am tired.			
Jessica <u>owns</u> a car.			
Howard <u>will always love</u> his first dog.
