Use

When we use more than one adjective, **OPINION** adjectives (beautiful, lovely) go before **FACT** adjectives (tall, long).
When we have more than one FACT adjective, the order is as follows:

How big/ long/wide?	How old?	What colour?	Where from?	What's made of?
