Capital Letters for Proper Nouns

Proper nouns: A **proper noun** is the name of a **single particular person**, animal, place or thing. It MUST ALWAYS have a capital letter.

- · names of countries and counties: Spain, Scotland.
- · names of people: Mike Smith, Barack Obama.
- When talking about yourself, the pronoun I is always written as a capital letter.
- · names of towns and cities: Edinburgh, Leith.
- · names of rivers, lakes/lochs, oceans and seas: Loch Lomond, the Nile.
- · names of days of the week: Monday, Saturday.
- · names of months of the year: January, December.
- · titles of books: 'Harry Potter and the Chamber of Secrets.'
