- En français, on utilise la structure [POUR + AVOIR + participe passé] alors qu'en anglais, on utilise [FOR + V-ing].

Exemples :

I'm thankful **FOR being** born indigenous to this continent.

→ *Je suis reconnaissante d'être une native indigène de ce continent.*

The settlers were not punished **FOR killing** Native American villagers.

→ *Les colons n'ont pas été punis pour avoir tué des villageois amérindiens.*

- On peut aussi utiliser **BECAUSE (OF + nom → en raison de...)** ou **AS / SINCE (= puisque...)**.
