I would ask the people/man/woman/children/etc. in the first picture if/why/how (often)/etc. subject + verb. / I would like to know if/why/how (often)/etc. the people/man/woman/children/etc. in the first picture + verb.

I also **wonder** if/why/how (often)/etc. the people/man/woman/children/etc. in the other picture + **verb**.

EXAMPLES:

- 1. I would like to know <u>how often the children</u> in the first picture <u>play board</u> games with their parents. I also wonder <u>if the elderly woman</u> in the other <u>photo has ever used</u> the computer before.
- 2. I would ask the young women in the first picture why they have decided to spend their spare time that way. I also wonder if the adolescents in the other photo really enjoy what they are doing.
