

Singular and Plural Nouns - Mixed Review 2

Remember these rules!

When a noun ends in a **consonant** followed by a **y**, change the **y** to **i** and add **-es** to make the plural (party ---> parties).

When a noun ends in **s**, **x**, **ch**, or **sh**, add **-es** to make the plural (dish ---> dishes).

Irregular nouns **completely change** (goose ---> geese).

Most other nouns are made by just adding **-s** to the end of the word (dog ---> dogs).

A **singular** noun names **one** person, place, or thing.

A **plural** noun names **more than one** person, place, or thing.

One fox	----->	six foxes
One city	----->	three cities
One church	----->	two churches
One class	----->	nine classes
