PAST PERFECT SIMPLE PAST PERFECT CONTINUOUS

Past perfect simple

(subject + had + past part)

- To talk about something which happened before something which is described in the past: When he got to the station, the train had left
- Tipically with time expressions such as: when, as soon as, after, before...
- She started driving before he **had fastened** the seatbelt
 - Often with these adverbs: already, just, never.

 He had never eaten steak and kidney pie until he came to England

Past perfect continuous

(subject + had + been + v-ing)

- To talk about something which happened before something which is described in the past BUT:
 - Focuses in the lenght of time

 Mandy needed a walk because she'd been sitting down all

 day
- Says how long something happened up to a point in the past He had been playing for Arsenal for only two games when he scored his first goal
