Adverbial expressions used as a response to show that you agree with the other person or people.

Affirmative Expressions
SUBJECT + AUX + TOO

Negative Expressions
SUBJECT + AUX + NOT + EITHER.

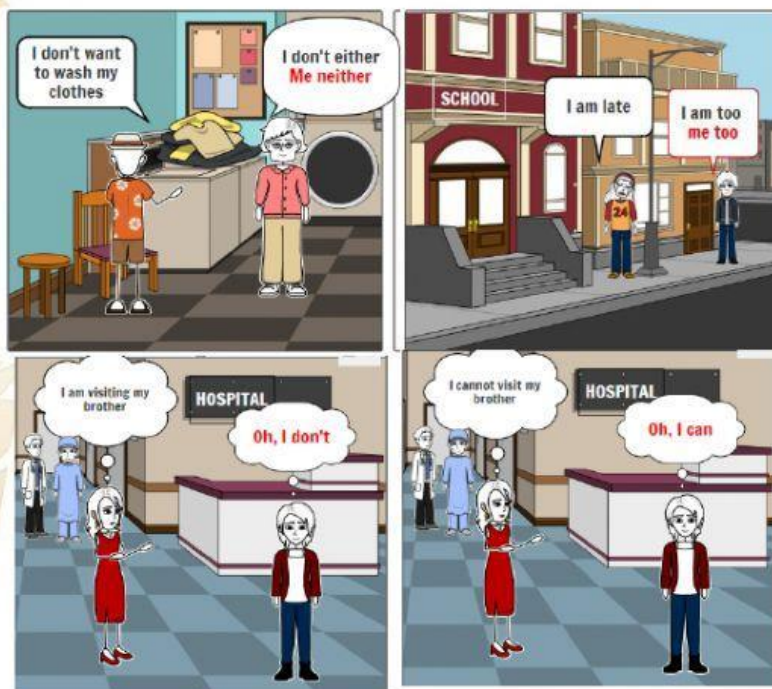
Verb to be : **AM, ARE, IS**

Other verbs: **DO, DOES, CAN**

When you don't agree use the opposite expression.

Affirm. **Oh, Subj + auxn't**

Neg. **Oh, Subj + aux**
