


RELIGION vs PHILOSOPHY _TASK ONLY_ONLINE.doc

GIST: One of your fellow classmates really wants to talk about religion, but it can be a touchy subject, so let's see if we can understand some very basic things about the topic, first. READ these terms, WRITE them down on a separate piece of paper, LISTEN to the video ONCE, MAKE a mark next to the terms EACH time you hear them, then afterward CLICK on the pulldown menus, and CHOOSE the right answers. WATCH OUT! Other classmates want to talk about food, instead, so they have inserted *at least* one thing not in the video.

DETAILED: Well, we know a little more than we did before, but not much, so to be able to talk about the similarities and differences between religion and philosophy, let's dig a bit more deeply. READ the questions twice, then - WITHOUT looking at the questions - LISTEN, again, TWICE. After that, TICK the correct TRUE (T) | FALSE (F) answers

BASED ON THE INFO IN THE VIDEO, WITHOUT listening, again. HEY, if you need to listen, again, to answer the questions, that's OK, just remember which questions they were, so you can talk about them with your teacher. BE CAREFUL!
