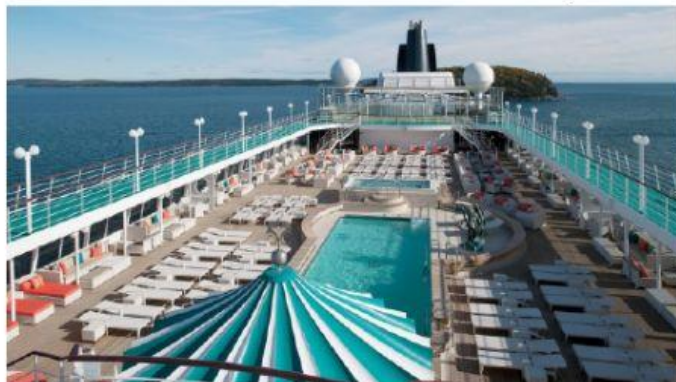


Read the text. Choose one of the variants A, B or C.
