

VERB TYPES

Action Verbs, Helping Verbs, Linking Verbs

Remember these rules!

- Every sentence must have a subject and a verb.
- An action verb shows a physical (swim, jump, write) or mental (think, believe, dream) action.
- A helping verb adds something to the main verb. They have no meaning on their own.
- There are 2 types of helping verbs: Auxiliary verb - am, has, do. Modal verb - can, might, shall.
- A linking verb connects the subject to other information about the subject (am, seem, being)
