- become – begin – bind – come – dig – drink – feed – find – get – hang – hold – lead – meet – ring – run – shine – shoot – sing – sink – sit – stink – swim – win
- c) Use your piece of paper to classify them in 5 groups with the same type of irregularity (more or less).
- d) Now write the three forms of each verb IN ALPHABETICAL ORDER inside each group, and fill in the gaps in the example sentences with **the correct form** of one of the irregular verbs.

Count the number of verbs in each group and use the examples to help you find out the chart where you have to write them.
