Vocabulary help: “A new girl“ (p.13)

at the back (of the room/ of the building/...)	
<i>These students are sitting at the back of classroom.</i>	
Mind your own business!	Emily always wants to know everything about other people's lives. What other people do is not her business! She should mind her own business!
not...either	(positive statement) <i>I like to go swimming and my friend likes that too.</i> (negative statement) <i>I don't like to go swimming and my friend doesn't like that either.</i>
after (+ noun + verb)	The opposite of <i>before</i> (+ noun + verb): <i>We have to wash our hands before we eat and after we go to the toilet.</i>
rude	the opposite of polite: We are polite when we say "Good morning", "Thank you" or "You are welcome". We are rude when we say "Mind your own business!" or "Shut up!".
