

Talking About Regrets

You can easily replace an "IF ONLY" sentence with an "I WISH" sentence to talk about present or past regrets.

Note that when you express regrets, the "ideal scenario" or "imaginary situation" is always different from "reality"_ "Mary can't speak Chinese! If only she could speak Chinese!" Look at the examples below: **Present Regrets:** Example: I don't have a dress and now I can't go to the party. Note that when you talk about present regrets, a) If only I (had) a dress now! you use the past form of the verb! b) I wish I (had) a dress now! Past Regrets: Example: I forgot my mom's birthday. I made her feel sad. Note that when you talk about past a) If only I hadn't forgotten her birthday? regrets, you use a perfect form of the b) I wish I (hadn't forgotten) her birthday! verb!* *The perfect form of the verb is a combination of $\frac{|HAD|}{|HAD|}$ + the past participle of the principal verb. You can also use SHOULD + HAVE + PAST PARTICIPLE of the principal verb to talk about PAST REGRETS. Example: I made a terrible mistake on my test! I got a very bad grade: a) If only I hadn't made that terrible mistake! b) I wish I hadn't made that terrible mistake! I shouldn't have made that terrible mistake!
