Clauses of place tell us where something happens.

Clauses of manner tell us how something happens.

Word expressions that introduce clauses of time are:

when, while, since, as soon as, before, the moment (that), until/till, after, by the time, whenever, as, as long as, etc.

Word expressions that introduce clauses of place are:

where, wherever, as far as, as near as, as high as, as low as, as long as, as close as, etc.

Word expressions that introduce clauses of manner are:

as if, as though, as, just as, exactly as, like, etc.
