PRESENT CONTINUOUS	A. Subject + verb to be + verb-ing + compl. N. Subject + verb to be + not + verb-ing + compl. I. Verb to be + subject + verb-ing + compl.?	<i>You are studying English</i> <i>You aren't studying English</i> <i>Are you studying English?</i>

PRESENT PERFECT	A. Subject + have/has + verb participle + compl. N. Subject + haven't/hasn't + participle + compl. I. Have/Has + subject + verb participle + compl.?	<i>You have studied English</i> <i>You haven't studied English</i> <i>Have you studied English?</i>
PAST PERFECT	A. Subject + had + verb participle + complements N. Subject + hadn't + verb participle + compl. I. Had + subject + verb participle + compl.?	<i>You had studied English</i> <i>You hadn't studied English</i> <i>Had you studied English?</i>
