## PASSAGE TWO: SMART

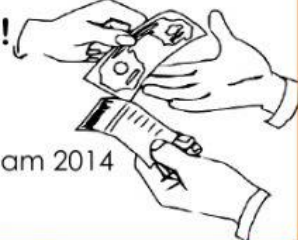
My dad gave me a one dollar bill

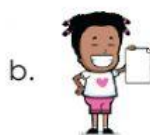

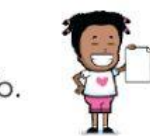
