- b) Copy this list of verbs on a piece of paper. They all have some things in common, and some things which are different from others:
- blow – cost – cut – draw – fly – grow – hit – hurt – know – lay – let – pay – put – read – say – sell – set – shut – swear – tear – tell – throw – wear
- c) Use your piece of paper to classify them in 5 groups with the most similar type of irregularity.
- d) Now write the three forms of each verb IN ALPHABETICAL ORDER inside each group, and fill in the gaps in the example sentences with **the correct form** of one of the irregular verbs.  
Count the number of verbs in each group and use the examples to help you find out the chart where you have to write them.
