Hello everyone! We are Maria Fernanda Torres and Andrés Felipe Gutiérrez, students of analysis and development of information systems, but today we are going to change our vocation a bit to teach them about phrasal verbs, because we want a lot more people to learn about these verbs that are quite used day a day.
Well, what are phrasal verbs? Phrasal verbs are idiomatic expressions that are formed by combining verbs with prepositions or adverbs. This results in new compound verbs with a meaning very different from the one given by the dictionary for individual verbs.
Today, we will explain the verbs: • Break down. • Break out. • Break up.
The verb Break can mean: rest, break, pause, among others. All this depends on the context of the prayer. Now that you are familiar with the subject, let's start!
Break down: First meaning: To break down or damage a vehicle, appliance or appliance. It is a separable phrasal verb. Second meaning: To break something down it is a separable phrasal verb. Examples: • The car broke down in our way to Cali. • Let's hope it doesn't break down now. • How will you break on the figures?
Break out: First meaning: Start something suddenly. It is a separable phrasal verb. Second meaning: Escape. It is a separable phrasal verb. Examples: • The fire must have broken out during the night. • The prisoners broke out easily from the prison. • Let's break out.
Break up: First meaning: End / break a relationship (loving in most cases). Second meaning: Stop a fight, meeting, etc... Examples: • He broke up with her last night. • They broke up recently. • She broke up with him because he was cheating on her. • They broke up the fight.
