

Active Voice and Passive Voice

Active voice means that a sentence has a subject that acts upon its verb.

EX. She **drinks** milk. → She (subject) → drink (act)




Passive voice means that a subject is a recipient of a verb's action.

EX. Milk is **drunk** by her. → Milk (subject) → is drunk (verb's action)

Change active to passive voice

1. Bring the object first.
2. Choose correct "Verb to be".
3. Change verb into participle (v.3).
4. Add "by" + subject.



Tense	Active	Passive
Present Simple	I do my homework.	My homework is done by me.
Present Continuous	I am doing my homework.	My homework is being done by me.
Past Simple	I did my homework.	My homework was done by me.
Past Continuous	I was doing my homework.	My homework was being done by me.
Present Perfect	I have done my homework.	My homework has been done by me.
Future Simple	I will do my homework.	My homework will be done by me.
Future be going to	I am going to do my homework.	My homework is going to be done by me.
