Zero Conditional

Conditional Sentence Type 0 ➔ Used for scientific / general truth.

The condition always has the same result

Form: If + Present Simple, + Present Simple

If + Present Simple, + Present Simple (Subj. + V.1) (Subj. + V.1)	Present Simple if Present Simple (Subj. + V.1) (Subj. + V.1)
If you heat butter, it melts.	Butter melts if you heat butter.
If-clause	Result clause or Main clause
If you heat butter,	it melts.

Form: If + Past Simple, + Past Simple

If + Past Simple, + Past Simple (Subj. + V.2) (Subj. + V.2)	Past Simple if Past Simple (Subj. + V.2) (Subj. + V.2)
If you heated butter, it melted.	Butter melted if you heated butter.
If-clause	Result clause or Main clause
If you heated butter,	it melted.
